The 2nd Project Meeting Kavala:

On the 13th of November 2019, ACTEDJ team participated in the 2nd project meeting which was hosted by PP 4 - Region of Eastern Macedonia and Thrace in Kavala/Greece. A SC meeting also took place. During the meeting the partners analysed the current status of the activities, future activities and deliverables, as well as financial and administrative aspects.



First Local Dissemination Meeting:

Meeting was organised by PP 4 - Region of Eastern Macedonia and Thrace in Kavala/Greece on the 13th of November 2019 at Galaxy Hotel.

39 stakeholders attended the event. The main topics of the event included a general presentation of the project DACIAT BSB-461, the current status and anticipations regarding the inland fish farming, fisheries in the Greek lagoons and indicators of biological integrity, prospects and opportunities for micro and macro algae cultivation in the Region of East Macedonia and Thrace, prospects for the cultivation of bivalve mollusks, problems and suggestions for the management of lagoons and freshwater of REMTH, Greek fish farming and sustainability, as well as sustainable development, innovation and blue entrepreneurship.



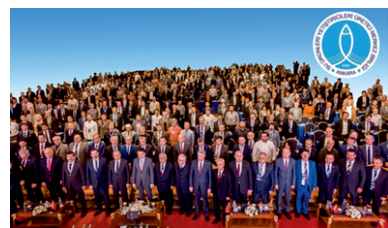
The 2nd Study Visit Kavala:

The event was organised by PP 4 - Region of Eastern Macedonia and Thrace in Kavala/Greece on the 14th of November 2019. The study visit allowed partners to see the practical implementation of good practices in their original context and to gain in-depth knowledge, while guaranteeing a balanced process of exchanging experiences.

Within the visit, project partners teams had the opportunity to see good practices that are implemented in the aquaculture sector in Greece.



Coordinator of KTU has participated to 8th Aquaculture Workshop in Antalya on 26-29 February 2020 which is organised by Central Union of Aquaculture Investors. Minister of Agriculture and Forestry and General Directorates of Fisheries and Aquaculture together with high level of bureaucrats, universities, fish farmers, suppliers and representatives of the international companies participated to the workshop. New support regime was announced by the Mr. Bekir Pakdemirli (Minister of Agriculture and Forestry), Mr. Altuğ ATALAY (General Director of Fisheries and Aquaculture). Recirculation, distant monitoring, feed and feeding, aquaponics, fish diseases were the main topics at the event.
