The event, focused on enabling an environment in which the participating SMEs had the opportunity to ask specific questions and to get more details about the good practices in each of the participating countries.

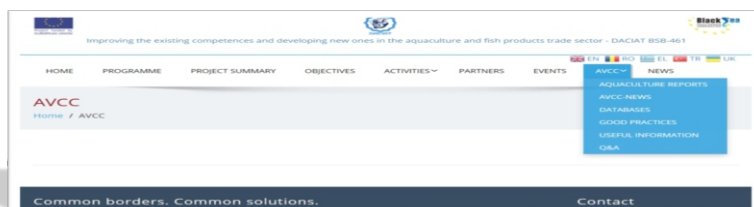
The discussions were focused on both good and bad practices, sharing valuable information regarding the business development (context - legislative and fiscal, business ideas, concepts of associations).
